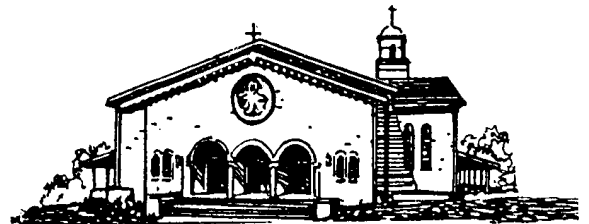

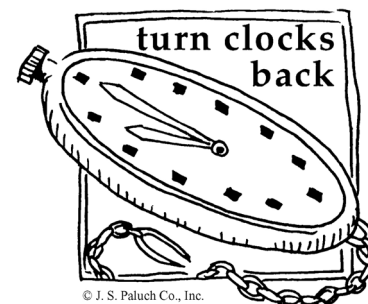

Ministers to the Sick

In addition to Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist who serve Communion at mass there is a dedicated group of people who bring it to the sick and homebound of our parish. This tradition goes back to the earliest Church. In the Acts of the Apostles, the Church appointed deacons to care for the poor and sick. The earliest mention of reserving the Blessed Sacrament outside mass was not for private devotion but so that it might be brought to the sick and elderly who could not be present at the liturgy.

There are three forums where we bring the Eucharist to those in need. The first is in hospitals. Normally one of the priests does this along with administering the Sacrament of the Sick if it hasn't been received recently. If the hospital stay is long-term a Eucharistic minister or the hospital chaplain might continue visits. Second, we bring communion to the homebound. These visits might take place for weeks, months or years. Often the parishioner is aged and unable to attend mass. Finally, we minister to people in nursing homes. Often these people are recovering from surgery but more likely they are permanent residents.

There is no getting around that ministering to the sick and homebound is a major commitment. But both ministers and recipients report they get a tremendous sense of satisfaction doing this vital work. Often for the receiver of the Eucharist the visit is a welcome moment that lifts the boredom of illness and immobility. Ministers report developing a deep bond with those they visit. It is after all one of the Spiritual works of mercy; cited by Saint Thomas Aquinas as specific duties of Christian people.

At the 11:00 mass this weekend we will commission our Ministers to the Sick. We thank them for their dedication for those who can't be part of the congregation and we pray that they find joy and gratification in their work. Beyond this I hope some of you will consider becoming a minister to the sick. If you're retired and have some extra time this is a way to get out, do good and deepen your faith.
